## President Message:

### The 3 R's for Periodontists

Many of us are old enough to remember the old standard for basic education **R**eading, **wR**iting and **aR**ithmetic. ## **“Reconstruction of the Posterior Maxilla Using Minimally Invasive Innovative Techniques and Materials”**

This program will include discussion of reconstruction of the posterior maxilla using the minimally invasive Balloon Sinus Approach with a variety of grafting materials. Innovative surgical instrumentation facilitating the procedure such as Ultrasonic Piezo devices and new designed drills will be shown in detail. Clinical cases will be shown with literature and histologic validation to improve the ability of the surgeon to select the appropriate techniques and bone regenerative materials for posterior maxillary reconstruction. Managing complications in sinus augmentations will be addressed.

## **“Immediate vs. Delayed Implant Placement in Extraction Sockets - What we know, what we think we know and what we don't know”**

Immediate placements of implants into extraction sockets is an exciting treatment alternative for our patients. However, there are many potential short and particularly long term risks which the practitioner must be fully aware of. ## **“Soft and Hard Tissue Grafting Around Teeth and Implants – Changes That Have Occurred in the Last 25 Years”**

Soft tissue grafting was developed to improve the esthetic outcomes of periodontal prosthetic reconstructions. The primary areas that were addressed were the edentulous ridges. This led to the development of the subepithelial connective tissue graft. As the results of this procedure were quite favorable, it led to the correction of recession around the adjacent teeth. Time led to the use of alternative methods and the degree of indications improved.

As implants arrived, we coupled the soft tissue procedures with bone regeneration techniques to rescue failing dentitions without resorting to traumatic procedures.

The presentation will describe long term results of both tissue regeneration and bone grafting in a variety of situations. Re-entry will illustrate the success of the techniques.
