**LANAP and Nd:YAG Laser for
Periodontitis and Peri-implantitis**

**New Directions in Periodontitis and

Lasers are an exciting new addition to the dental armamentarium and are increasingly being used for / applied to various dental procedures by general dentists, periodontists, and other specialists. When used appropriately, lasers offer certain advantages over a conventional armamentarium. Knowledge and understanding of basic laser principles are important for every dentist to better deal with various marketing claims. This course will familiarize the clinician with different types of lasers, laser physics, laser-tissue interactions, and laser safety.

The use of lasers for periodontal therapy is becoming more common in clinical practice today. Periodontal procedures utilizing lasers that will be highlighted in this presentation will include esthetic gingival tissue management, non-surgical and surgical treatment of periodontitis and peri-implantitis, and osseous surgery. Scientific evidence will be presented which includes human histologic results demonstrating cementum-mediated new attachment in the treatment of periodontitis.
